- <u>SA Citations Plus</u>: This group of databases provides extensive coverage of local and international information indexed by South African organisations.
- SA e-Publications: This database consists of 287 South African journal titles.
- <u>SA Gazette</u>: Legal information consisting of the Government Gazettes (from January 1994); the Provincial Gazettes (from September 1995) and the Parliamentary Bills (from January 1999)
- SA Law Reports: Legal information
- <u>SA Media</u>: One of the most comprehensive press cutting services offering you access to a database consisting of more than 3 million newspaper reports and periodical articles which have been indexed on computer since 1978.
- SA Statutes & Regulations: Legal information
- <u>ScienceDirect</u>: A leading full-text scientific database offering journal articles and book chapters from more than 2,500 peer-reviewed journals.
