

Honorary Doctor of Philosophy in MANAGEMENT SCIENCES (ENTREPRENEURSHIP)



Ms Daphne Mashile-Nkosi

Ms Daphne Mashile-Nkosi is a dynamic businesswoman. She is the sitting Executive Chairperson of Kalagadi Manganese (Pty) Ltd, and she has founded several companies in South Africa, of which she is a shareholder and board member.

Initially known as "Kalahari Resources (Pty) Ltd", Kalagadi Manganese (Pty) Ltd was established in 2001 by several Black South African female entrepreneurs, with Ms Mashile-Nkosi at the

lead. In 2005, Kalahari Resources applied for, and was granted a new order mining right to prospect for manganese in the Kalahari Basin, Northern Cape.

Under the guidance and leadership of Ms Mashile-Nkosi, the decision to build the largest manganese ore processing plant in the world was informed by the country's policy position to beneficiate products locally, so that value is derived across the entire value chain before the products are exported. Such a position promotes job creation and economic growth in the Northern Cape community.

Ms Mashile-Nkosi is also a social activist. Detained by the Apartheid government for her role as an activist, she has fought hard to be where she is now and continues to advocate female empowerment and self-reliance in South Africa. To date, she has ensured that at least 70% of the shareholders of Kalagadi Manganese are women and continues to make a difference in the lives of women and their families.

Ms Mashile-Nkosi is also the founder and patron of the Stanley and Daphne Nkosi Foundation (SDNF), which has uplifted and created an impact in various communities around the country. The SDNF is driven by three key pillars, namely the development of ordinary people; the development of infrastructure in the health and education sectors; and, lastly, inspiring South Africans to build themselves. Currently, the SDNF is partnered with the Chris Hani Baragwanath Academic Hospital, as well as the Zakithi Nkosi Clinical Haematology Centre of Excellence, which treats patients from South Africa and neighbouring countries who suffer from cancer and blood disorders. In this regard, and under further guidance from Ms Mashile-Nkosi, the Zakithi Nkosi Paediatric Haematology and Oncology Clinic has recently been built, and Africa's largest trauma ward refurbished.

Ms Mashile-Nkosi serves on various company boards, and she has received several international awards in business leadership.
