Having considered the documents filed of record and having heard the legal practitioners,

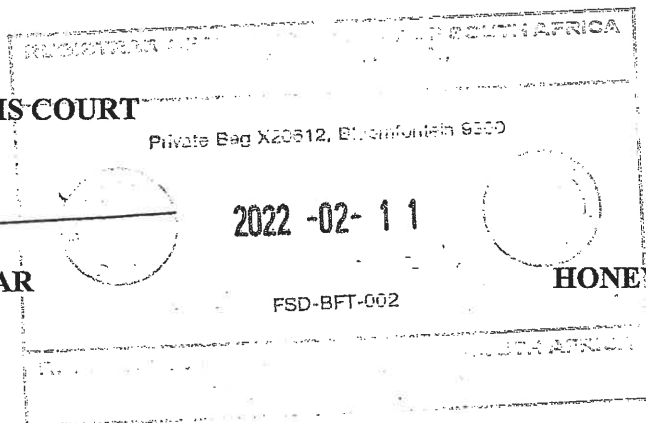
IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. Condonation is granted to the applicant in respect of the applicant's non-compliance with the usual forms and manner of process, time-periods, service as prescribed by the Uniform Rules of Court as well as the applicant's non-compliance with Rule 41A and that this application be enrolled and heard as an urgent application on ex parte basis in terms of the provisions of uniform rule 6(4) read with rule 6(12).
2. The rule *nisi*, is issued, calling on the respondents to show cause why (if any) on **10 March 2022 at 09:30** why an order in the following terms should not be granted:
 - 2.1 That the respondents are prohibited from directly or indirectly doing anything which directly or indirectly obstructs, impedes, disrupts, postpones, delays or interferes with the academic registrations, welcoming and other functions at the applicants Bloemfontein Campus and residential students intake, as well as tests or examination processes and/or the orderly academic education, administration and ordinary student activities of the applicant and/or blockading of entrances, roads (feeder roads included), and buildings and/or damaging any property situated on the applicants' campuses, whether movable or immovable and regardless of who the owner thereof may be;
 - 2.2 That the respondents be prohibited from directly or indirectly barricading of entrances or buildings, molesting, assaulting, threatening or intimidating any student, member of staff, employee, contractor or official of the applicant, including any person present on the applicant's premises who may not fall into one of these categories;
 - 2.3 That the respondents be prohibited from in any manner whatsoever inciting, taunting, encouraging, instigating, prompting and/or provoking other individuals or students to perform any of the acts described in paragraphs 2.1 and 2.2 above.
 - 2.4 That the Sheriff of this Honourable Court with assistance of the South African Police Services be authorised and directed to without delay remove from the property and premises of the applicant any respondents who refuse to comply with paragraphs 2.1, 2.2 and 2.3 above.
 - 2.5 The costs of this application is to be paid by any of the respondents opposing the application and/or not adhering to the order granted herein, jointly and severally, the one paying the other to be absolved.

3. The relief in paragraph 2.1, 2.2, 2.3 and 2.4 above shall serve as an interim interdict with immediate effect.
4. Service is to be affected in the following manner:
 - 4.1 By serving a copy of this court and notice of Motion on the first to fourteenth respondents at the applicant's premises insofar as possible;
 - 4.2 By affixing a copy of this order and notice of motion to all official notice boards on the applicant's campus properties and/or campus entrances;
 - 4.3 By keeping a copy of the Notice of Motion as well as the court order at the administration building of the applicant's premises, for inspection and so that any respondent who request a copy during normal office hours may be supplied with one;
 - 4.4 By the Sheriff of the Honourable Court reading out the order, in English, by megaphone at such places and occasions on the applicant's campus as may be deemed necessary to bring the order to the notice of the respondents;
 - 4.5 By handing a copy of this order to any respondents who are removed from the applicant's campus premises pursuant paragraph 2.4 above;
 - 4.6 By sending the order to the known email addresses of the 2nd to 14th respondents.
5. The record of these proceedings must be transcribed by the official court transcribers without delay and the transcribed record be served on the respondent.
